FORMAT OF THE CHALLENGE CUP

The Challenge Cup is the match play between the East of Scotland and the West of Scotland.

The appointment of a captain of both the East of Scotland and the West of Scotland shall be decided at the AGM before the day. Each captain shall select himself and five members.

The order of Match Play is Greensomes in the morning and Singles in the afternoon.

One point is awarded for each match won. Half point is awarded to both teams if a match is tied. The side with the most points at the conclusion of the Challenge Cup matches wins the trophy of the Challenge Cup.

If, at the conclusion of the Challenge Cup matches, both teams have the same points, the team which last won the event retains the Challenge Cup trophy.

Playing Handicap

If you are a member of your home club affiliated to Scottish Golf Union, you must follow your home club handicap. If you have no home clubs, the SDGA shall confirm your playing handicap.

Greensomes

"Greensomes" play is a pairs match with a 3/8 combined handicap allowance. Both players tee off and then choose the better tee shot – thereafter players must play alternate shots until the hole has been completed. If one team has handicap allowance of 11 and the other team has handicap allowance of 14, then strokes are taken at index holes 1, 2 and 3.

In the case of players not turning up for Greensomes, one point each shall be awarded to the opposing team.

Singles

"Singles" is a single match. A player wins the match when he is up by more holes than there are holes remaining to play. If one player has handicap of 10 and the other player has handicap of 17, then strokes are taken at index holes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7.

In the case of players not turning up for Singles, one point each shall be awarded to the opposing team.
